
THE STEEPLE

Coming as I do from Georgia, well below the 40th parallel, I find myself easily lulled to relaxation when, as if with a seasonal flick of the switch, the sun begins to accompany us for longer stretches of the day. My pores open wider and my UV-starved skin drinks eagerly of this golden abundance. I hear a familiar call and, as I glance out my window, I spy a comfortingly familiar sight—a bright red cardinal perched atop a crabapple tree, belting an ageless, pleasing melody beneath a decadent blue sky. *Hosanna*.

For the brief spell of eternity it took me to notice this lavish scene (I mean to really notice it), I forgot about what it was that was troubling me just a moment or so before—an ever-growing to-do list; a sickness afflicting a dear friend; a death that has layered more grief onto an already grieving friend; a news article about 1.1 million Palestinians imminently facing famine; a recent report about all migratory species threatened with extinction, one constellation of many reminders of the ecological crises we face. Breathe.

Breath, beauty, and sunshine—these are good medicine. As our beautiful patch of valley continues to thaw, as a greater diversity of bird neighbors and pollinators make more frequent visits, and as our joints and limbs loosen from the cold, may we avail ourselves of every good grace we can.

May we notice more deeply what is happening around and within us. May we move—and still—our bodies to rhythms that please us. And may we remember that our bodies, too, are the Earth, and that there is no greater act of faithfulness than treating them well. For the actual love of God, let's commit to taking gentle care of our somas.


